Easter begins with the mighty work of God raising His Son from the grave at a moment and in a manner that no human eye observed. Easter begins, not with the satisfying of our curiosity as to how a dead body could begin to stir and move and stand up and push the rock away and walk out into Joseph's garden. Easter begins with the mystery and the grandeur of that deed by which the Father glorifies his Son by declaring Him victor over death and all that brought Him to the Cross and grave. Easter has to do with God's will to present His risen Son as the answer to our sin and our death-prone ways as people who live in a fallen world. Easter begins with God's action and grace through his Son - for the forgiveness of our sin.

**TEACHING POINTS**

Teaching Point 1: ***The grave could not hold Jesus.***

Teaching Point 2: ***There are credible witnesses to the resurrection.***

Teaching Point 3: ***The resurrection changed lives.***

**ACTION POINT**

God is ever trying to give us hints of eternity, sending us so many faithful men and women whose lives are hid with Christ in God. He is trying in every way He can to show us where Easter begins, where it leads, and finally what its ultimate goal is. And, particularly, He sends us his Son who gives us the forgiveness of sin, makes us in right standing with the Father, and shows us God’s love. Christ is now seated at the right hand of God in glory, and yet is also present with us now in the Gospel which we proclaim in Word and Sacrament. Let us be bold about our faith in view of God’s great love for us!
