## Rev. Thomas Emery "Love Is What Life Is About" John 17:6-19 Salem Presbyterian Church May 10, 2015

This passage from John reminds us that from the beginning of creation itself, God chose to love us. God is the initiator of our relationship. It's God who chose us, not the other way around. God chose us to love.

#### TEACHING POINTS

**Teaching Point One:** We are commanded to love. To be a follower of Jesus Christ is to love our families, love our friends, and even love our enemies.

Teaching Point Two: Real love is sacrificial.

Teaching Point Three: Life is about loving others.

### THIS WEEK'S MEMORY VERSE

"This is my commandment: Love each other in the same way I have loved you."
(John 15:12 NLT)

### **ACTION POINT**

We love because Christ first loved us; unless we have Christ's love in our hearts, we simply cannot love others who are outside of our circle of intimate relationships. We simply do not have the power to love as Christ loved us, unless we have Christ's Holy Spirit within us. Then and only then can we fulfill His command to love others as He has loved us. That is what the cross is about. We see His love poured out on the cross of Calvary. The Golden Rule, as wonderful as it is, is insufficient for this task. We are not simply to do unto others as we would have them do unto us. We are to do unto them as Christ has done unto us.
