People throughout history have been searching for a way to God. The author of Hebrews portrays Jesus as the pioneer who opened the way to God. Jesus broke down the wall separating us from God. We discover through Jesus that God desires to be in a relationship with us, “in bringing many children to glory.” Thanks to Jesus, we can count ourselves as God’s children. We may from time to time endure setbacks and suffering here on earth, but thanks to Jesus we can look forward to a future where God has the last word for each one of us.

TEACHING POINTS

ACTION POINT

However, how can we know God understands? That Christ understands? He does, because he became like us in every respect.
