Rev. Thomas Emery "Dealing With Suffering" Hebrews 4:12-5:10 Salem Presbyterian Church October 11, 2015

Why do innocent people suffer? Many suffer grievously. Why? Our hearts break when we see little children stricken with awful diseases. Why do the elderly suffer? Some of you have seen one or both of your parents battle cancer or heart problems or Alzheimer's. Nothing they have done could ever merit such suffering. Of course, suffering doesn't have to be physical. Some of our deepest scars may never show on the surface.

TEACHING POINTS

Teaching Point 1: One very popular way of coping with suffering is to take it out on someone else. You can be nasty with other people, because "misery loves company." If you are suffering, you try to make yourself feel better by making someone else feel worse.

Teaching Point 2: *Pain always occurs in life*. Even Christ could not avoid pain and complete His mission and neither can we.

Teaching Point 3: Our suffering reminds us of our dependence on God. At an early stage in our lives, we think that we are in total control of things. In our minds, we are captains of our destiny. But suddenly life deviates out of our control.

THIS WEEK'S MEMORY VERSE

"Even though Jesus was God's Son, he learned obedience from the things he suffered."

(Hebrews 5:8 NLT)

ACTION POINT

Remember, as Jesus was nailed to a cross, His back was raw from beatings. Jesus must have yearned for a way to move, to change positions, or redistribute his weight. But he couldn't. He was paralyzed by the six inch nails. God had felt the exact piercing sensations that racked His body. Yet, it is comforting to turn to Christ, and to know there a God who has felt the full array of human emotions that we have. Maybe this is what the writer of Hebrews meant when he said that Christ learned obedience through suffering. Suffering is a great teacher. It teaches us compassion for others. It teaches us dependence on God. During our suffering, we can pray to a God who understands what we are going through!
