Rev. Thomas Emery "Be the Last" Mark 10:35-45 Salem Presbyterian Church October 18, 2015

In our context, James and John feel like they have a special relationship with Jesus. At least they feel they've somehow earned special consideration. Likewise, sometimes you and I go to God with that same type of attitude, don't we? We're Christians. We're church volunteers. We give generously to the church's work. We deserve for God to listen to our requests and to grant them even though God may have a different plan altogether. "Teacher," James and John said, "We want you to do for us whatever we ask." "What do you want me to do for you?" Jesus asked. They replied, "Let one of us sit at your right and the other at your left in your glory."

TEACHING POINTS

Teaching Point One: *Jesus did not condemn James and John for their ambition.* Jesus wants his followers to seek after greatness.

Teaching Point Two: We're all special to God.

Teaching Point Three: *Jesus points to the path of discipleship*. On that path, they are called to accept whatever experiences are allotted them by God, even experiences equal in severity to those endured by Christ.

THIS WEEK'S MEMORY VERSE

⁴³ "But among you it will be different. Whoever wants to be a leader among you must be your servant, ⁴⁴ and whoever wants to be first among you must be the slave of everyone else." (Mark 10:43-44 NLT)

ACTION POINT

The story of James and John says to us that it's all right to be ambitious though misused ambition can be a dangerous thing. It also challenges us to seek a greatness the world simply cannot understand. We are called to serve others. I remember something a Christian athlete said years ago, "In a world where the goal is to be in 1st place and even 2nd place isn't seen as good enough, we are called to be in 4th place. We're called to put God 1st, Family 2nd, Others 3rd, and Self 4th." That's a godly servant's heart.
