

# Rev. Thomas Emery "Temptation" Luke 4:1-13 Salem Presbyterian Church February 14, 2016

Lent teaches us many pleasant and most useful things concerning temptation and the trials that are sure to come. The devil completed every test against Jesus, and he departed but only until a future trial. That's unsettling knowing that Satan is not finished with us. The most significant and relevant point that comes into play is in our need to be watchful at all times. Will we be ready? It mostly depends upon our spiritual adaptability. Our best assumption is that he will be back again and again when we least expect it.

#### **TEACHING POINTS**

POINT ONE – All of us will be tempted.

**POINT TWO** – We can resist temptation with God's help.

**POINT THREE** – *Trying to love God with all your heart, soul and mind is the best defense from temptation.* Turning our eyes toward Jesus is the best escape.

#### THIS WEEK'S MEMORY VERSE

<sup>5</sup> Then the devil took him up and revealed to him all the kingdoms of the world in a moment of time. <sup>6</sup> "I will give you the glory of these kingdoms and authority over them," the devil said, "because they are mine to give to anyone I please. <sup>7</sup> I will give it all to you if you will worship me." (*Luke 4:5-7 NLT*)

### **ACTION POINT**

What have we learned from Jesus' battle with the enemy of every person? As we prepare to celebrate Easter, Lent becomes that fertile period of self-denial of temptations of our own choosing. God allows the testing to make us spiritually strong and steadfast. Look around you. What kind of friends are you keeping? What kind of places do you frequent? What does your checkbook say about the way you spend your life? We have six weeks ahead of us to equip ourselves to say to the devil, "Go back where you came from, for Christ is here." Praises be to God that God will be with us in all our trials and tribulations.
