Jesus's disciples are called to be trustworthy shepherds of God's people in contrast to Israel's current religious and political leadership. The choice of twelve followers is representative of Israel's twelve tribes and signals that Jesus is redefining Israel around Himself and the coming of God's kingdom. In the commissioning and empowering of the Twelve, Jesus grants them the authority to heal and cast out demons and limits their mission only to the people of Israel. The message they are to preach, is virtually identical to the one Jesus and John had been preaching to the Jewish crowds that the Kingdom of God is coming soon.
