Reformation Day October 31, 1517

A single event on a single day 500 years ago changed the world. It was October 31, 1517. Brother Martin Luther, a monk and a scholar, had struggled for years with his church, the church in Rome. He had been greatly disturbed by an unprecedented indulgence sale. Can we buy our way into heaven? Luther had to speak out.

But why October 31? November 1 held a special place in the church calendar as All Soul's Day. On November 1, 1517, a massive exhibit of newly acquired relics would be on display at Wittenberg, Luther's home city. Pilgrims would come from all over, genuflect before the relics, and take hundreds, if not thousands, of years off time in

purgatory. Luther's soul grew even more vexed. None of this seemed right.

Martin Luther, a scholar, took quill in hand, dipped it in his inkwell and penned his 95 Theses on October 31, 1517. These were intended to spark a debate, to stir some soul-searching among his fellow brothers in the church. The 95 Theses sparked far more than a debate. The 95 Theses also revealed the church was far beyond rehabilitation. It needed a reformation. The church, and the world, would never be the same.

One of Luther's 95 Theses simply declares, "*The Church's true treasure is the gospel of Jesus Christ.*" That alone is the meaning of Reformation Day. The church had lost sight of the gospel, because it had long ago papered over the pages of God's Word with layer upon layer of tradition. Tradition always brings about systems of works, of earning your way back to God. It was true of the Pharisees, and it was true of medieval Roman Catholicism. Didn't Christ Himself say, "My yoke is easy and my burden is light?" Reformation Day celebrates the joyful beauty of the liberating gospel of Jesus Christ.

What is Reformation Day? It is the day the light of the gospel broke forth out of darkness. It was the day that began the Protestant Reformation. It was a day that led to Martin Luther, John Calvin, John Knox, and may other Reformers helping the church find its way back to God's Word as the only authority for faith and life and leading the church back to the glorious doctrines of justification by grace alone through faith alone in Christ alone.

It kindled the fires of missionary endeavors, it led to hymn writing and congregational singing, and it led to the centrality of the sermon and preaching for the people of God. It is the celebration of a theological, ecclesiastical, and cultural transformation. So, we celebrate the October 31st Reformation Day. This day reminds us our obligation, to keep the light of the gospel at the center of all we do.

How Firm a Foundation

In 1787 Dr. John Rippon published A Selection of Hymns from the Best Authors as a supplement to Isaac Watts' classic Psalms and Hymns. Among these original hymns



was the title "*How Firm a Foundation.*" By R. Keene, who was at one time a song leader in Dr. Rippon's church. It is known to have been the favorite hymn of General Robert E. Lee and was sung at his funeral. It is also said that once, while conducting evening prayers in Princeton Seminary's Oratory, Dr. Charles Hodge was so overcome with feeling during the last line of the hymn ("*I'll never, no never, no never forsake,*" from Hebrews 13:5) that he could no longer sing but only gesture the words.

Perhaps the most noteworthy and appreciated feature of this hymn is how closely it resembles the passages of the Bible (which is fitting, given that its theme is the solidity of the word of God). For a sample of the many parallels consider that Stanza 3 echoes Isaiah 41:10:

Fear not, I am with thee, O be not dismayed, For I am thy God and will still give thee aid; I'll strengthen and help thee, and cause thee to stand Upheld by My righteous, omnipotent hand.

Fear not, for I am with you; be not dismayed, for I am your God; I will strengthen you, I will help you, I will uphold you with my righteous right hand.

Do the Unsaved Immediately Go to Hell?

The question here is about when do the unsaved go to hell. There are two schools of thoughts on that.

1. Some believe that the unsaved lay unconsciously in the dirt, waiting for their final punishment. 2. The other school of thought is that they go directly to hell, awaiting their final consequences of their sins. Both schools of thought agree with the final judgment of the wicked. I will let you decide which one is the correct one.

Luke 16:19-31 tells the parable of Lazarus and the Beggar. "The time came when the beggar died and the angels carried him to Abraham's side. The rich man also died and was buried. In hell, where he was in torment, he looked up and saw Abraham far away, with Lazarus by his side "... 'between us and you a great chasm has been fixed, so that those who want to go from here to you cannot, nor can anyone cross over from there to us (to warn the rich man's brothers before they died)'" NIV.

School 1 of thought believes this was a parable and that Jesus was trying to give the message that if the people of His day were not listening to Moses and the Prophets, even someone raised from the dead would be unable to convince them. The parable itself is just a made-up story to make a point. It may have been a popular belief, but we should concentrate only on the message, not on the content of the parable. School 2 of thought believes that this story is quite different from Jesus' other parables. In none of His other parables, is Jesus using a specific name. What is even more interesting is that a man named Lazarus was actually resurrected by Jesus Himself (see John 11:43-44) and although his testimony was true, the chief priests who had

rejected Jesus, were planning to kill him as well (see John 12:10), thus rejecting the testimony from someone coming from the other side.

Also, this school of thought notices that although this story was directed to the Pharisees (see Luke 16: 14, 15), no reaction is mentioned from them after Jesus finished his story. Generally, when they disagreed with Him, they opposed

Him fiercely (read all 4 gospels). Why wouldn't they oppose Him now? Wouldn't it be a perfect opportunity to contradict Jesus in front of everyone concerning heaven and hell? They did not. Why? Because they believed in heaven and hell after death as well.

Job 27:19-20 "*He lies down wealthy, but will do so no more; when he opens his eyes, all is gone. Terrors overtake him like a flood*" NIV.

School 1 says that this happens at the resurrection of the wicked. School 2 says: Can it be any more clear? The sinner lies down and his body appears to sleep, but he instantly opens his eyes and realizes he is no longer in the body and physically existing in this world. Immediately terrors take hold of him.

Now the Bible also talks about the Day of Judgment, when the unsaved will be judged for what they have done. Here again there are two schools' of thought, one proclaiming that this destruction is complete annihilation (body and spirit) of the unsaved. This is why it is called the second death. The other school of thought is that the unsaved will suffer in the lake of fire for eternity. I will use but a few Bible texts on that topic and will let you decide which school of thought is the correct one.

Matt 25:41-46 "Then he will say to those on his left, 'Depart from me, you who are cursed, into the eternal fire prepared for the devil and his angels. For I was hungry and you gave me nothing to eat, I was thirsty and you gave me nothing to drink..." "They also will answer, 'Lord, when did we see you hungry or thirsty or a stranger or needing clothes or sick or in prison, and did not help you?' "He will reply, 'I tell you the truth, whatever you did not do for one of the least of these, you did not do for me.'



"Then they will go away to eternal punishment, but the righteous to eternal life"" NIV.

2 Thess 1:7-9 "This will happen when the Lord Jesus is revealed from heaven in blazing fire with his powerful angels. He will punish those who do not know God and do

not obey the gospel of our Lord Jesus. They will be punished with everlasting destruction and shut out from the presence of the Lord and from the majesty of his power" NIV.

Rev 20:14-15 "Then death and Hades were thrown into the lake of fire. The lake of fire is the second death. If anyone's name was not found written in the book of life, he was thrown into the

lake of fire" NIV.

No matter what school of thought you do believe in, the future of the unsaved does not look too appealing. The Bible records truth. The many fulfilled prophecies are proof of that, as well as our many personal experiences with our Heavenly Father. The unsaved will eventually all end up in the lake of fire!

Are you saved my friend? The Bible is true and one day you will face judgment (Heb 9:27 "*Man is destined to die once, and after that to face judgment*" NIV.) Don't act like the foolish speeder who tells himself that he will never be caught speeding by the police. Sooner or later he is caught and is facing the consequences of his infractions. It isn't too late to accept Jesus' offer.

Where are you heading? It is your choice my friend! Will you invite Him into your heart (Romans 10:9-10) and enjoy His peace into your life?

The Music Committee News

The **Music Committee** was recently informed by the Lima Pipe Organ Company that our Organ needs repair. The blower air reservoir has developed splits in the seams of the wood box. This reservoir contains the high-pressure wind generated by the blower. To properly have it repaired, it will require removal of the blower, and the entire reservoir will be disassembled and structural repairs performed. The work will require the organ to be out of service for two weekends. The cost of this work is estimated at \$5,300.00. The work has been scheduled for the month of January. We are pursuing this project as we strive to maintain this beautiful instrument that is an intricate part of our church and heritage.
