Our church is collecting **packets of gravy** for the Salvation Army Christmas baskets. Our goal is 400 to 500 packages.



"The Tales of Three Women" Ruth 1:1-18
Salem Presbyterian Church
November 4, 2018

A famine in their homeland of Judah had driven Elimelech, his wife Naomi, and their two sons to emigrate from Bethlehem, across the Jordan to the land of Moab. Moab was always more fertile than Palestine. In time, all three men, father, and two sons, (each of whom had married a Moabite woman) died, leaving Naomi with her two daughters-in-law, Ruth and Orpah. Seeing no future for a widow in a foreign land, Naomi decided to return to Judah and urged Orpah and Ruth likewise to return to their Moabite families who would care for them. Ruth chose to cast her lot with Naomi and in effect to become responsible for the older woman whom she would be accompanying.

## **TEACHING POINTS**

*POINT ONE – Love is about loyalty and faithfulness and mutual devotion.* 

*POINT TWO – God takes care of His people.* 

POINT THREE – If there is a problem, we can solve it together! If there is a burden, we can lift it together with God's help!

## THIS WEEK'S KEY PASSAGE

<sup>16</sup> But Ruth replied, "Don't ask me to leave you and turn back. Wherever you go, I will go; wherever you live, I will live. Your people will be my people, and your God will be my God (Ruth 1:16 NLT).

## **ACTION POINT**

Ruth had come to recognize the God of Elimelech's family as the God of her life. She had learned of this God who had seen the distress of the Israelites in Egypt and come to their aid. She now worshiped the same God who would not allow Cain to evade responsibility by asking, "Am I my brother's keeper?" Of course, he was! So, it was this faith in the Hebrew God that led to her insistence on staying with Naomi. Are there responsibilities that you should shoulder that you are trying to avoid, perhaps following the bad example of the unspecified crowd? Are you living out the duties you undertook when you chose to follow Jesus Christ as Lord and Savior? The Book of Ruth calls you to pause and to consider your commitments to God and others.

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
