

In contrast to a past king as security, Isaiah comes to the temple for worship and sees a vision of the real Lord seated on a throne, sovereign of the whole of heaven and earth, the King of Kings, the LORD Almighty (v. 5). The contrast between the limitlessness of Yahweh's reign and the limitations of the earthly king's reign might serve as reassurance at this time of transition. Isaiah sees God's holiness, realizes his fallenness, and is introduced to an offer to be God's messenger as a go-between God's court and mankind.
