The next Session Meeting is on February 9th at 11:30 AM.



Today's Bible passage is about the Hebrew people who are yearning to know God up close and personal. They knew that God had chosen them and set them apart for His missionary reasons, and God had a plan to deliver them from their suffering and make them a model of justice and prosperity. For hundreds of years, they had been waiting and searching for the promised divine King of Israel. They had been yearning to see His arrival. And now, through the words of the prophet Isaiah, God is offering to introduce Him. But they are soon to find out that the face we see in Isaiah's passage is not the face they expected to see.

#### TEACHING POINTS
