TEACHING POINTS

POINT ONE – The God of all creation so loved the world that God entered into our heartaches, our weakness, our suffering--and on the cross of Calvary took the burden of our sin away.

POINT TWO – The Christian faith is built on the foundation of the law and the prophets but their witness is not enough.

POINT THREE – When we open ourselves to God's love, our response is obedience.

ACTION POINT
