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Rev. Thomas Emery 3rd Sunday in Lent "The Lord Is Among Us!" – Exodus 17:1-7 Salem Presbyterian Church March 15, 2020

Following the directions of God, the Israelites journey to Rephidim, where they find no water, and they quarrel with Moses to the point that he fears for his life. God instructs Moses, "I will stand before you on the rock at Mount Sinai. Strike the rock, and water will come gushing out" (17:6 NLT). In Paul's narration of the lessons to be learned from the wilderness events, he states that the people drank "from the spiritual rock that followed them, and the Rock was Christ" (1 Cor. 10:4 NRSV). Along the way, Israel increasingly lost their faith and began complaining and grumbling to Moses about water (15:22–27), food (16:1–36), and then water again (17:1–7). Each time, God provided for them. In 17:7, however, their doubts went to an extreme when they asked, "Is the Lord among us or not?"

TEACHING POINTS

POINT ONE – We need to lift our eyes from "this world" to the spiritual realm.

POINT TWO – *Realize that we can have too high of expectations.*

POINT THREE – Our Lord is always with us.

THIS WEEK'S VERSE

I will stand before you on the rock at Mount Sinai. Strike the rock, and water will come gushing out. Then the people will be able to drink." So Moses struck the rock as he was told, and water gushed out as the elders looked on (Exodus 17:3 NLT).

ACTION POINT

Israel is traveling in this story, as this day, the church is proceeding. Israel's story is our story. There in the desert, it made for an inconsistent scene: a multitude of people who had been freed, led, and fed by God, wondering aloud whether God was there or not. Israel was rescued from slavery in Egypt. Likewise, we have been redeemed by the cross and resurrection of Jesus Christ out of our slavery to sin and death. You and I, like Israel, are making our way through the wilderness toward a promised land of rest. We are midway between our redemption and our final salvation in the Kingdom of God. During Lent, prayerfully hold firm in your faith in the hope of the coming Kingdom of God. The Lord is among us!

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
