

"God Looks at the Heart" – 1 Samuel 16:1-13

Considering the subject of who will be the king of Israel, our passage shows us the vast personal differences of Saul compared to David. God calls Samuel to anoint the youthful David, and compared to Saul, David is not large. While Samuel is a bit amazed at whom God chose, God prompts him, "Man looks at the outward appearance, but the Lord looks at the heart" (16:7). The Spirit of God comes upon David after he is anointed by Samuel (16:12–13). Even though Saul remained king, it is David who has the empowering Spirit of God.

TEACHING POINTS

POINT ONE – We shouldn't rely on first impressions.

POINT TWO - Have a heart that is open to the heart of God so God can make a connection with us and do significant things.

POINT THREE – God will show us what to do, give us instructions on how to do it, and send us where it must be done.

THIS WEEK'S VERSE

But the LORD said to Samuel, "Don't judge by his appearance or height, for I have rejected him. The LORD doesn't see things the way you see them. People judge by outward appearance, but the LORD looks at the heart" (1 Samuel 16:1-7 NLT).

ACTION POINT

In the passage, we see the process that God grasps that it's time to choose a new king; this time, it will be someone whose heart is rooted in God. Not a seasoned warrior, bent on leading with his own will and his dreams of glory and prestige. But it will be someone who will actually put God first and put God's goals first. The Lord reminds Samuel that He considers our inner qualities rather than our outward appearances. What are your inner qualities?
