Please sign up for the June **Ice Cream Social** Drive-thru June 18, 4:30 – 7 pm; the sheets are on the back table.

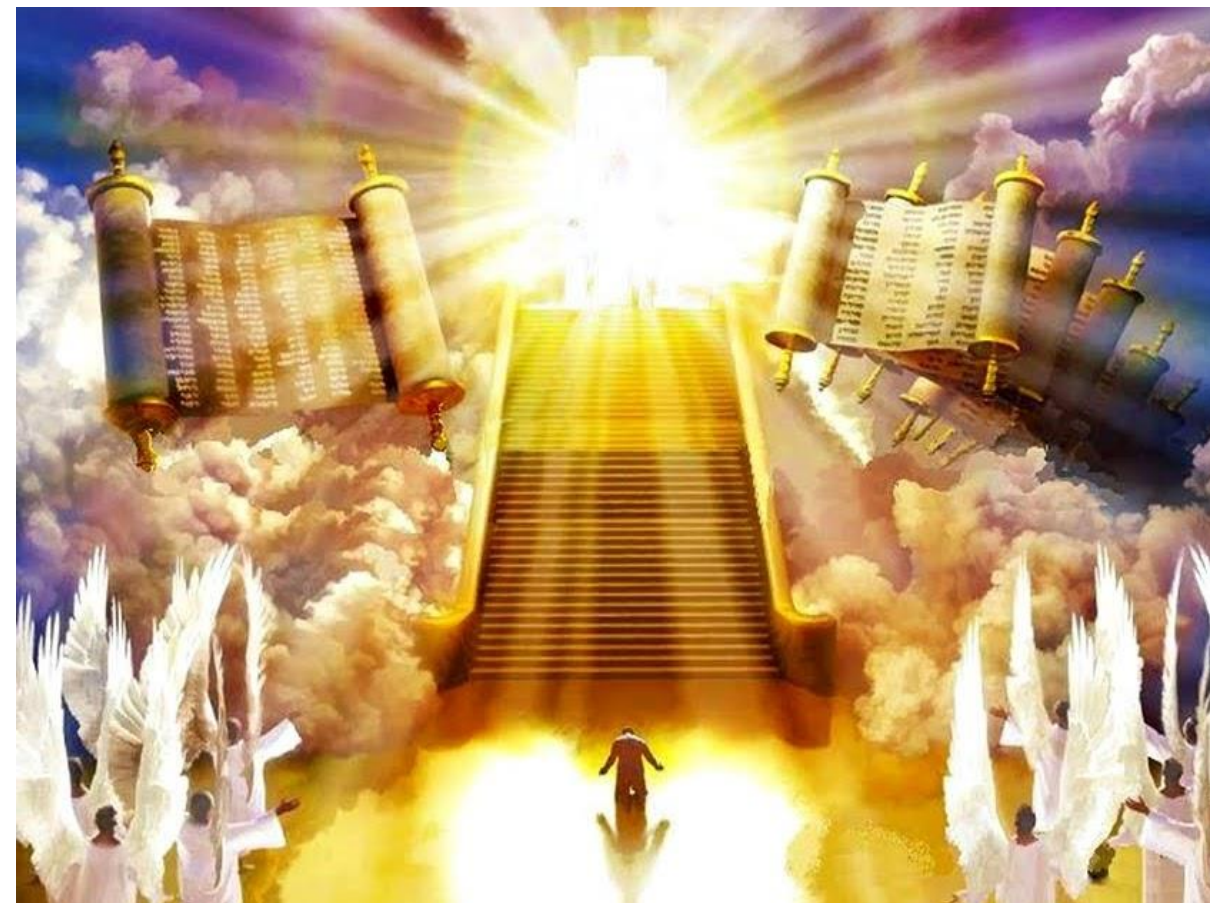
