It is a story we see time and time again. The person who trusts in God experiences great heartache but, somehow, he or she comes through that heartache with more faith and not less. Rarely does the Bible part the curtains like in the Book of Job so that the reader can catch a glimpse of what is happening behind the scenes of human history.
